

Make sure you practice on sample tests, and ask for suggestions:


- What to expect on the exam

- Other people who may disturb your selfconfidence, focus and relaxation




CONTROL:



Board Meeting Summary December 14, 2022

Locally Developed Course Approval: The Board of Trustees approved the acquisition of the following Locally Developed Courses for use in the 2022-2023 school year: Content Literacy 15/25-3&5, Surviving Financially as an Adult 25-5, Social Skills 15-5, Self Directed Learning 15-3 and Cake Decorating 15/25-3.

2023-24 Draft Calendar: Two drafts were shared with trustees for consideration. Feedback will also be collected from staff and school councils. ATA Local Round Table Discussion: The Provincial ATA is seeking feedback on the future of education in Alberta. The Local ATA will be hosting a session for parents, staff and other community stakeholders in January 2023.

Rural Education Conference: Trustees will be attending the Rural Education Conference in March 2023. Micheal Unger will be speaking about resilience in schools and Dr. Emily Milne will speak to reconciliation. Myrnam School will be highlighted as one of the sessions. Grad Tokens: The trustees approved the sponsorship of tokens for the graduates of St. Paul Education.

Leadership Report

Professional Growth Plan Meetings: Superintendent has completed first visits with all principals where he spoke to leaders about their goals and their plans for school improvement.

RCMP Collaboration: Senior Leadership team met with Staff Sergeants from three local detachments to discuss RCMP involvement in supporting the division's emergency protocols and the roles of School Liaison Officers.

Meeting with the Deputy Minister: Superintendent met with Deputy Minister Tremblay on December 2. The access to education mandate letter and challenges related to staffing were discussed.

Leadership Team Meeting: School leaders met for their monthly collaboration meeting on December 6. Curriculum, cost saving and school engagement were discussed.

CASS Zone ²/₃ Meeting: Superintendent met with other division leaders on December 9. The new teacher code of conduct was discussed. Staff webinars highlighting the changes will be available in the new year.

Ordination of New Bishop: Superintendent attended the ordination and installation of Bishop Franken for the Diocese of St. Paul on December 12. There were many local clergy in attendance as well as several who traveled a great distance or participated virtually.

Christmas Goodwill Activities: Many schools are participating in service projects that include collecting donations for the food bank and animal shelter, collecting toys for Santa's Elves, making Christmas shoe boxes and sharing the gift of song with local seniors. Thank you to our students and staff for giving back to our communities.

AHS Addiction and Mental Health Support: Our Family School Liaison Worker team met with St. Paul Mental Health Children's Therapist, Christina Stolth, on November 18. Thank you to AHS Addiction and Mental Health for providing this valuable opportunity to collaborate and share best practices around supporting child and youth mental health and wellness.

Doug Yeo Scholarship: F.G. Miller Jr./Sr. High School is the recipient of the Doug Yeo - Youth in Action Award for 2022-23. The school's Student Committee will use the scholarship to organize activities related to community service, character education, and healthy lifestyles. New Curriculum: K-3 teachers have had several opportunities to come together since last spring for New Curriculum learning. Meetings for teachers in Grade 4-6 have been set to help prepare teachers for the incoming Mathematics and Language Arts curricula. In April 2023, final K–6 curricula for Science, Fine Arts, French Immersion Language Arts and Literature, and French First Language and Literature are due to be released and expected to be implemented in September 2023. Teachers, parents/guardians, and education partners are welcome to learn more about the implementation timeline for Alberta's K-6 curriculum by accessing the <u>Curriculum Implementation Information Hub</u> on <u>New LearnAlberta</u>.

Catholic Education: Schools have celebrated Advent masses with their students and the sacrament of reconciliation. For informational purposes, upcoming newsletters from our Catholic schools will contain information about the 5 Marks of a Catholic School.

Literacy and Numeracy Committees: These committees are working on developing literacy and numeracy frameworks for the division. New Teacher Mentorship: As part of our mentorship training, our division group of new teachers have met on three occasions to learn more and reflect about items like the Teaching Quality Standard, supervision and evaluation, classroom procedures & routines, inclusive education and trauma.

Science Fair: Registration is now open for the 2023 Science Fair, being hosted by St. Paul Education in partnership with the St. Paul and District STEAM Society. Students in grades 1-12 who are interested in participating can do so by registering <u>here</u>.

FNMI Programming: Nominations are now open for the Honoring Spirit: Indigenous Student Awards. The deadline to nominate a student is February 2, 2023. More information about the awards can be found <u>here</u>.

Literacy Team: The Inclusive Education Literacy Team will be doing summative assessments for the Reading Ready program in January. Early indications are cause for celebration as there will be many little graduates!



Board Meeting Summary December 14, 2022

Secretary-Treasurer's Report

Audit of Financial Statements: The 2021-22 statements are posted on the division website. The Division had budgeted for a deficit of \$1,122,943 and ended the year with a deficit of \$1,688,875 on \$59,500,097 in expenses. While the difference is less than 1% of our budget, it is nevertheless significant and is owing to lower than projected enrolment, additional staffing costs, covid related expenses, increased insurance, bus fuel increases, repairs and general inflation. The projection for the current year is for a deficit of \$996,398 following which division reserves will be reduced to minimum levels meaning that the 2023-24 budget will need to be balanced.

Scholarship Program: Thank you to the community sponsors of our local scholarship program and congratulations to the student recipients for their hard work.

Enrollment: Enrollment projections for 2023-24 are due to the province in January.

Information/Correspondence

Access to Education Order: The provincial government has announced regulatory changes that ensure all students have access to in-person learning and that family choice for masking in schools is protected.

New Code of Professional Conduct: Effective January 1, 2023, a new code of professional conduct will provide a clear and fair set of requirements to guide teachers and teacher leaders no matter where they are employed.

Mental Health Pilot Grant: The division's application has been approved for the two year pilot program focused on enriching mental health supports in schools. The division will receive just over \$34,500 to support emotional literacy and digital citizenship education in all schools. Together We're Better Funding Increase: The division's Mental Health Capacity Program has received a contract uplift of \$5,700 to support inflation costs.

Parent and Teacher Advisory Councils: The members of my Minister's parent and teacher advisory councils have been announced for 2022/23. Both councils will work at the provincial level to share diverse parent and teacher perspectives and provide input on education issues. Christmas Concert Schedule: Christmas concerts will be happening across the Division in the upcoming week. Thank you to students and staff for their hard work preparing for the performances and celebrations.

ACSTA: Trustee Andersen provided a brief update on bylaw, faith formation, succession, the AGM and invited people to donate to Toonies for Tuition at www.CCSTA.ca.

ASBA: Trustee Wiebe provided a brief update on the AGM. The MLA Breakfast was well attended. Trustees are not able to sign up as lobbyists. The <u>Alberta.ca</u> website has opportunities for public engagement. School boards can expect requests to use reserves to take approximately six weeks. Advocacy toolkit is being developed for school councils.

Trustee Attendance Schedule: Trustees reported on their past and upcoming schedules including school councils, fall meetings and Christmas concerts and celebrations. Trustee Rajoo shared accolades from the owner of the Daycare in Two Hills to the Maintenance Department for their exemplary service in preparing for the community's daycare.
