

POST-SECONDARY APPLICATIONS

Mrs. Morrison is available to help students with applying to post-secondary. If you are applying to a post-secondary institution in Alberta, you can apply online through the ApplyAlberta website. If you are thinking of going out of province or out of country, please talk to Mrs. Morrison, as your application process will be different. Also keep in mind that University of Alberta has entrance scholarship applications due January 10th and UCalgary as well on December 1st. USask also has a Best & Brightest Scholarship due Dec 15. Applying early will give you access to these applications.

AFTER YOU APPLY

After you submit your application, it's very important to check your emails regularly as well as the mail. You typically will get an email shortly after you apply stating your student ID number and instructions on how to access your student portal with that school. Please read the whole email carefully as they will outline your next steps to securing your offer of admission or of further evaluating your application. It's VERY important to be checking the student portal every week and if you are able to, your college email address.

October 11, 2023 BOARD MEETING HIGHLIGHTS



Name Change Review

Due to financial constraints, the Board approved a motion to postpone indefinitely their initial motion to review the Division name. Any further review will include seeking feedback from parents and stakeholders.

Ward D Vacancy

Communication on the SPERD website and within the schools newsletters should reflect that, as accommodation for the Ward D vacancy, Trustee Melvin Abraham is appointed as the representative for the Ashmont area, and Trustee Sylvie Smyl is appointed as the trustee representative for the Mallaig area.

Enrolment Update

The Division is looking at options for reducing expenses by \$300,000 as a result of lower than projected enrolment. Several areas are to be reviewed including opportunities for savings through attrition.

Bags for Breakfast

Thank you to Cornerstone Co-op for their generous donation of \$18,420 for our school breakfast programs. This donation is made possible with the use of reusable grocery bags.

Restorative Practices

At the October leadership meeting principals received an overview of restorative justice, an alternative to traditional discipline practices. The Division is looking at adopting restorative practices as a way to increase opportunities for student success and high school completion. Several of our schools will be participating in additional training throughout the year.

Post-Secondary Night

Our annual Post-Secondary Night is on Tuesday, October 24, 2023 from 7:00 - 8:30 p.m. in the gymnasium of St. Paul Regional High School. Post-secondary schools from all over Alberta will be in attendance. Students of all ages and their families are welcome to attend and explore options for after high school.

Provincial Achievement Tests and Diploma Exams

The province is in the process of changing Provincial Achievement Tests and Diploma Exams from paper to digital format. Grade 6 teachers have the option to pilot or field test the new digital format during the current school year. The province's proposed timeline is to fully implement digital assessments by the 2024-25 school year.

Lieutenant Governor Visit

On September 28 the Lieutenant Governor Salma Lakhani visited the New Myrnam School following the meeting of her majesty at the winning of the prestigious Alberta Emerald Awards in the spring of 2023.

Mallaig Design Initial

On October 10 BR2 Construction, Alberta government and SPERD representatives met to discuss the initial phases of the Mallaig School Design.
